20 Book Challenge

For the past year, grades 3, 4, and 5 have been working on the 40 Book Challenge. Some of the grade 2 students have asked about it, so we will be starting the 20 Book Challenge this month! The 20 Book Challenge will challenge students in grade 2 to read 5 fiction books, 5 nonfiction books, and 10 books of their choice. Fiction or Nonfiction?

It's important to know the difference between fiction and nonfiction. Fiction books are stories that did not happen in real life, whereas nonfiction books are books with information that are intended to teach you something.
